Description: H.O.P.E. was a nonprofit organization chartered in Atlanta in December 1958 to prevent the closing of public schools which desegregated, as had happened in parts of Virginia and Arkansas. The HOPE, Inc. records consist of correspondence, minutes, reports, and printed and published materials generated by the organization from 1958-1961. The records also contain correspondence, newsletters and mailings from segregationist groups, and a vast quantity of newspaper clippings, including from the *Augusta Courier*, which document the school closure crisis in Virginia, Arkansas, and Georgia. Information on Metropolitan Association to Continue Segregation (Atlanta, Ga.), Committee on Human Rights for White People (Atlanta, Ga.), and Separate Schools, Inc. (Atlanta, Ga.).

Description: Gordon Hall began compiling the collection when he returned from World War II and encountered U.S. domestic hate groups at both ends of the political spectrum. Along with a group of volunteers, including Grace Hoag, he infiltrated and investigated radical and dissenting groups, collecting their printed propaganda as part of his efforts to preserve these irreplaceable materials for posterity. Only the 168,000 items representing 5470 organizations found in Part I of the collection have been processed, documented and made available to the public so far (as of 2000). Part II

comprises 800 cartons (2,400 linear feet or *ca.* 700,000 items), ranging in date from 1945 to 1999. The collection focuses on printed organizational literature, often ephemeral, some for circulation among adherents and others used to proselytize. WCF, a state-wide organization, was a coalition of concerned citizens and organizations with the specific aim of preserving the civil rights of all Washington citizens. HOW was created to specifically oppose initiatives 608 and 610, which sought to limit the rights of Washington citizens and legalize discrimination based on sexual orientation. Hands Off Washington Whatcom County Coalition was a county branch of the state-wide HOW project. Contained in these records are administrative and financial records as well as a large amount of subject and reference material relating to gay and lesbian issues, but not specifically limited to either Whatcom County or Washington State. For the subject files, HOW amassed a wide variety of materials pertaining to oppositional organizations, including both local and national conservative groups. Over the course of a career lasting more than fifty years, he accumulated materials that fill more than 180 boxes. The collection includes materials on a wide range of subjects with an emphasis on the menace of communism, both foreign and domestic. Hargis's opposition to desegregation on the basis that it was a "Communist conspiracy" is well documented in the papers, which also contain materials pertaining to radical student groups and the black nationalist movement. The Hargis papers include approximately 300 newspaper titles from both sides of the political spectrum, including titles with fundamentalist Christian, anti-labor, patriotic, neo-Nazi, and white supremacist viewpoints, as well as titles with ecumenical, anti-war, pro-labor, socialist, Communist, radical student and black nationalist viewpoints. The research and correspondence files of Allen Zoll and the New York-based National Council for American Ed-

Peale; David Atlee Phillips; Oral Roberts; Kermit Roosevelt; William Safire; and DeWitt Wallace. Other materials include correspondence regarding *Legend: The Secret World of Lee Harvey Oswald*, by Edward J. Epstein; a speech about Alexis Carrel given by Lindbergh at Georgetown University; a manuscript by Clare Boothe Luce; and a transcript of a speech in honor of DeWitt and Lila Bell Acheson Wallace by President Richard M. Nixon.

Stand Up and Be Counted!* (Robert & Virginia Heinlein ad attacking a SANE advertisement calling for an end to nuclear weapons testing, claiming that it is straight Communist propaganda (*Colorado College Tiger*, April 18, 1958).
