Myszkowski of the Jastrzębiec Coat of Arms (Vol. 6 p. 499-506)

Myszkowski of the coat of arms of Jastrzębiec , in Kraków Voivodeship. A house in Poland thickened with works of honor and honors. You wrote for a long time from Mirów and Przeciszów. I read Mikołaj Kreza and Paweł Myszkowski in the Privilege of the City of Kraków. Jędrzej, scholastic from Gniezno, canon from Kraków in 1446 in Nakiel. in Michow. f. 481. Jerzy of Przeciszów, Canon of Gniezno, Chancellor of the Łaski Archbishop of Gniezno, in 1512. Later, two brothers, Piotr and Mikołaj, flourished. Piotr, I read it first, castellan from Wieluń in 1493. on the list of Albrycht Król, given to the city of Lublin, then castellan from Rospirski in 1496 in Łask. in the stat. fol. 110. Genealogy of this house, he wanted him and castellan from Oświęcim, in the end he became Łęczyca voivode and grand marshal of the crown in 1504. in Łaski statute. fol.

112 of these four sons remained: the first Peter, first the Starost von Lemberg 1502. Acta Terrestr. Leopold. then castellan from Sądecki, voivode from Bełski died, but Sterilis was Geneal. I am from Piotr Myszkowski, he read about the castellan from Wieluń in 1527. Kromer mentions him lib. 30. that in the days of King Albrycht he had an army of considerable importance; 2. Stanisław, castellan of Miedzyrzecki sterilis, with this title I saw him on the list of Zygmunt I, given to the cities of Lublin and Cracow in 1538. 3. Wawrzyniec, castellan from Sądecki, 1540. in Nakiel. in Michov. fol. 717. A brave man whom Bielski testifies to having killed Jan Prince Zatorski in 1513. Orichovius in Quincunce says that on the occasion of Orsa, [p. 500] armed, chased after Moscow with Pałeczki and Zborowski, though he quickly swam the river, leaving the daughter of Paweł Bystron's wife and four sons. 1. Mikołaj, the heir in Spytkowice, crowned in 1548. on the list of King Augustus given to the city of Lviv, then the castellan of Radom from 1553. In that year with Jadwiga Minocka, Duchess of Staniątecka, a specific treaty for the good from Sendzin and Krassów was made by: finally castellan from Wojnicki, Oświęcim, Zatorski and Miedzyki, Starosta, that is Geneal. but he does not write the year \*) that with Zofia Jan Komorowski, the castellan from Połaniecki, a daughter, he had only two daughters, Barbara Piotr Zborowski, first from Sandomierz, then the voivode of Kraków, second Zofia, Jan Maciejowski, castellan from Sandomierz, woman sterile. 2. Stanisław the Crown Tailor and Krakowski's troops signed a letter from August I to Ustrzycki in 1553, he and Starost of Malbork died childless. 3. Kszysztof, first castellan from Oświęcim in 1563. Const. fol. 86. then Rawski, 1569. Const. fol.

Jędrzej, Wawrzyniec's fourth son, castellan from Sądecki, army from Krakowski, then castellan from Lublin and starost from Lubaczów, had Zofia Sienicka behind him, with whom he fathered three sons. 1. Mikołaj, Canon of Kraków

and Pastor of Pułtusk. 2. Stanisław the Lublin cupbearer. constant 1586. fol. 405. This first voto was taken by Zofia from Czeniec, whose only son with Marianna Cieciszewska, Stanisław's daughter, left two daughters, Anna Czerwińska, from whom the descendants remained; Michał, Walentyn, Zofia, Konstancja, Teresa, Anna and Katarzyna Czerwińskie and Katarzyna Stanisław Drzewiecki, the Lublin carpenter's wife. 2 to note, Stanisław took Katarzyna Sienińska, Stanisław's daughter, and fathered Maurice by her, who entered the convent. 3. Piotr, was castellan of Lublin, starost of Oświęcim, Ojców and Tyszowiecki, since the Sejm of 1603. Deputy of the Rawska district. constant fol. 823. This would have been expected of the Myszkowski family if it weren't for the male sex from the second line: Katarzyna Drohiczanka, he fathered a daughter Agnieszka, Konstanty Tomicki, the castellan from Wieluński, and sons
