"I don't have a Bible at home, and I don't like to read it from the Internet. O, buying a Bible as a solution? No, that's too expensive, by the way, what do you think of my hair and nails? Just 'did' them yesterday",

"I find it very dull to read the Bible,"

"I started reading once, but the Old Testament scares me,"

"Once in a while, I read the Bible, and what I read makes me angry or sometimes guilty,"

"I tried to read it, but I don't understand it,"

"I only read the pastors notes during the sermon; that's enough for me,"

"My relationship with Jesus and the Holy Spirit is enough for me; I don't need the Bible; the Bible is rigid."

"The Bible is all about what you cannot do; I find that discouraging,"

"O, I know the Bible and all the Bible stories. What was the last time I read it? During my childhood, I suppose, I had a kid's Bible. What my age is, near 40, why? I know it all,

especially the stories. I don't need to read it over and over again."

"The Bible, is it not written in Old English? I don't understand Old English",

"Reading the Bible, really? Why?"

With that last response, I can definitely help. With the other questions, I can help too, but you need to be willing to read this small book. I'm definitely not going to convince you to read it. And don't get me wrong because reading your Bible is more important than reading every book that a human, including mine, writes.

I've thought a lot about the reasons people don't read or study their Bible. I can come up with a lot of them, but I think the main reason is that they don't understand the importance and significance of it. They don't get it. It is my firm Believe if you know the importance of the Bible, you will read it. I genuinely believe this. But there's still a but.

It all comes down to choices. Eventually, the choice is up to you and not to me whether you're going to read the Bible or not. I made my choice many years ago.

And what I've learned from it, I want to share with you. I can help you to pick up the Bible and read it like never before. But even then, if I do, so I am only human. There is Someone who wants to help you more than I do. His Name is the Holy Spirit. I pray that you will open up your heart and mind so that the Holy Spirit will be able to lead, explain and help you during the reading of this little book. The Bible is His book, and only He can lead you through it. I hope you will accept my humble help to guide you through this book.

Before I explain why reading the Bible is so important, I will first explain what the Bible is not meant for.

What the Bible is not meant for

I am not a historian, but I will tell you something about history.

Many wars are fought in the Name of the Lord, and many scriptures were misused; today, they still are. All for their own sakes and to gain more power. There are many wars to write about; I will bottle it down to the following ones:

order to kill in the Name of the Lord.

Many slaveowners tried to validate their cruel actions to slaves based on the Bible. Many times I've heard the theory that the Bible is written by a bunch of white folks to put down black people. As hard as this period was, this theory is foolish and not accurate. It is just another form of misusing the Bible. First of all, the Bible is mainly written by Jewish people, who had their own nation in mind while writing it. It is through Jesus Christ that non-Jewish people have full access to the Bible. Second of all, my statement is a half-truth.

The truth is, it is written by God according to 2 Timothy 3:16.

"All scripture is given by inspiration of God....." -KJV- the word inspiration in Greek means breathed, so it is Godbreathed. In other words, the Bible is of God. (extra information: the Old Testament was written in Hebrew and Aramaic, the New Testament was written in Greek)

And what about all the women throughout centuries who were put down, mistreated, taken advantage of only by misuse of scripture? The amount is abundant. The worst part is that it is still happening today. Unfortunately, this is not only happening by misusing scripture, but also other religious books.

Following, there are all kinds of cults; other ways people use to corrupt the Bible. Some are even worse than others, but the root remains the same; misuse and teaching of the Bible to manipulate people. Think about Jim Jones of Peoples Temple's cult; he carried out the unthinkable mass suicide in 1978, poisoning 918 members. Or Warren Jeffs, leader of the polygamist (this means men who marry multiple women) church. Jeffs is or was in jail due to the sentence for raping two teenage girls. (he still runs or did run the church out of prison, I am not sure if he is still imprisoned). Or think about the leader of Waco, David Koresh.

The cult was responsible for a shootout and a 51-day FBI standoff, which resulted in the death of David Koresh and 82 of his followers. You can watch the series about this cult named Waco on Netflix. I watched it together with my husband in less than two days. There are many more cults, too many to write about in this book. But, I think you get the picture, and this is definitely not how our Lord intended to handle His Word, the Bible.

But enough about history. Let us take a look at this day and age. First, there is the so-called 'name it and claim it' movement. They teach the power of faith to create your own reality to get what you want. The focus is all upon wealth, power, and the 'name it, claim it and receive it' thought. Don't get me wrong, I am not against people and don't want to be a 'know it all type,' definitely not.

I just think the former is a misuse of the Bible and is more focused on what you want to have. As a matter of fact, the best part is missing; a genuine and authentic relationship with Jesus Christ. I do believe in prosperity, that the thoughts of God toward us are of peace, not of evil, and to give us an expected end. I do not believe in the 'name it and claim it' movement. This movement is focused on the goodness of the Gospel and the results of a relationship with the Lord instead of the actual relationship with Him. It is all love-based, but love can be challenging as well, and most of the time, this is omitted out of the teachings:

"For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it." Matthew 16:25 KJV

You have to lose your life in order to gain it. Not your life, but His life is what it is all about. In my opinion, the 'name it, claim it' teaching includes only part of the gospel.

From this extreme, the 'name it claim it' guys, we will go to the other extent: extremely religious people. They only
