# A Wake-up Call from the Future

"You can't use an old map to explore a new world."

ot too long ago, I experienced the future by letting a driverless V car navigate me through the streets of San Francisco. I was on a business trip and staying at a hotel in downtown Union Square. I'd read a lot about Google's spin-off Waymo and General Motors's subsidiary Cruise to operate 24/7 hail-riding services in the city and was curious to test one out. Rumor has it that the cars cost more than \$200,000.00 each and are fitted with hundreds of high sensors and cameras to ensure a safe ride. I didn't know what to expect and felt nervous, but as somebody who writes and speaks about the future, I always try to embrace new experiences, even life-or-death ones. I first decided to get a coffee for a good dose of courage and opened the Waymo app, just like Uber or Lyft. My destination was a well-known restaurant where San Francisco's Golden Gate Park meets the Pacific Ocean. I pressed "go," and a message alerted me that my Waymo ride was on its way and that it would take around nine minutes to arrive outside my hotel. Still drinking my coffee, I followed my ride as it approached the hotel and waited with a mix of fear and excitement. A few moments later, I watched as a gleaming white Jaguar pulled up on the other side of the road with its distinctive Waymo logo on the side.

My first reaction was embarrassment as people nearby started staring at the car, and I was tempted to cancel the ride immediately. The writer Hilary Mantel said, "The question is not who influences you, but which people give you courage." It takes courage to step into the unknown, but FOMO (Fear of Missing Out) is also a powerful motivator; it is always easier when you don't overthink.

The ancient Stoics were right. "Do faster than doubt," I said to myself. As I walked across the road, I could feel my heart racing. I reached for the door handle, but it wouldn't open. I could feel the stares fixated on my next move. I needed to press the "unlock" button on the app, and the handles came out of the door so I could climb inside. "Hello, Trip," a voice said through the car's speakers. "Please don't touch the steering wheel or pedals during the ride. For any questions, you can find information in the Waymo app, like how we keep our cars safe or clean." As my ride pulled away, a pedestrian gave the car and me a scared look and said, "WTF." I felt the same. As the future happens faster than ever, there is fear and excitement, but is enough being done by leaders to seize the future boldly because technology changes quickly, but humans don't?

## "NOBODY KNOWS WHAT'S GOING TO HAPPEN."

Sam Altman, CEO of OpenAI, has a sign above his desk that reads, "Nobody knows what is going to happen." This could be the headline news for leaders today as they grapple with multiplying disruptions in AI, geopolitical risk, wars in Ukraine and the Middle East, talent shortages, and industry convergence. It's disruption everywhere and all at once and shocks upon shocks. With economic headwinds and tech disruption an everyday reality, we should not waste one of the most significant reframing moments because the future isn't just about technology and trends. It's about mindsets and choices, too. Zombie leadership, where dead management ideas live on, and the curse of sameness are seductive leadership biases. Knowing serves us well in a linear, predictable, and stable world. It is radically different today: the compounding effect of extreme disruption, difficult-to-predict challenges,
