AACR NextGen Grants for Transformative Cancer Research

Purpose: The AACR NextGen Grants for Transformative Cancer Research represent a funding initiative to stimulate highly innovative research from young investigators. This grant mechanism is intended to promote and support creative, paradigm-shifting cancer research that may not be funded through conventional channels. It is expected that these grants will catalyze significant scientific discoveries and help talented young investigators gain scientific independence. The grants provide US\$450,000 over three years for expenses related to the research project, which may include salary and benefits of the grant recipient, postdoctoral or clinical research fellows, graduate students (including tuition costs), and research assistants, research/laboratory supplies, equipment, travel applicable to the research project, publication charges for manuscripts that pertain directly to the funded project, other research expenses, and indirect costs.

Eligibility: Applicants must have a doctoral degree (PhD, MD, MD/PhD, or equivalent) in a related field and not currently be a candidate for a further doctoral degree. At the start of the grant term applicants must hold a tenure-eligible appointment (or equivalent, if institution does not follow a tenure system) at the rank of assistant professor (appointments such as research assistant professor, adjunct assistant professor, assistant professor research track, visiting professor, or instructor are not eligible; applicants that have progressed to associate professor appointments are also not eligible.); have held a tenure-eligible assistant professor appointment for less than three years; and work at an academic, medical, or research institution anywhere in the world. If eligibility is based on a future position, the position must be confirmed at the time of submission, and CANNOT be contingent upon receiving this grant.

AACR-AstraZeneca Career Development Award for Physician-Scientists, in Honor of José Baselga

Purpose: The AACR-AstraZeneca Career Development Award for Physician-Scientists, in Honor of José Baselga was established to honor the life and legacy of Dr. José Baselga, who was a scientific leader and supportive mentor to an entire generation of physician-scientists. Dr. Baselga's research focused on novel molecular targeted therapeutics and he played a leading role in the clinical development of multiple cancer drugs. The intent of this program is to encourage and support early-career physician-scientists to conduct research and bolster the development of innovative targeted therapeutics. The proposed projects may be translational, clinical, or population sciences in nature and focused on all aspects of oncology.

Eligibility: At the start of the grant term (November 1, 2026), applicants must: 1. Have a medical degree (MD, MD/PhD, DO, or equivalent) in a related field. 2. Hold a faculty position with the title of assistant professor, instructor, research assistant professor, or the equivalent. Applicants who have progressed to associate professor appointments are not eligible. a. If eligibility is based on a future position, the position must be confirmed at the time of submission and CANNOT be contingent upon receiving this grant. Applicants are advised to contact the AACR's Research and Grants Administration (RGA) at grants@aacr.org before submitting their Letter of Intent to confirm they will hold an eligible position. 3. Have started their first independent faculty position within the past 6 years from the start of the grant term (as indicated on the employment offer letter). Exceptions to the 6-year window may be granted for up to 12 months of parental or justified personal/family leave. Applicants exceeding the 6-year limit who believe they are eligible must contact the AACR's RGA before submitting their Letter of Intent. 4. Be able to commit at least 50% of full-time effort in research (applies to total research, not just the proposed project) during the grant term. Commitments less than 50% may be allowed and will be determined on a case-by-case basis by the AACR's RGA. 5. Have independent laboratory space and be able to hold independent funding as confirmed by their institution. 6. Have a valid, active medical license in the country where the research will be conducted. 7. Work at an academic, medical,

or research institution anywhere in the world. At the start of the grant term (November 1, 2027), applicants cannot: 1. Be a candidate for a further doctoral degree. 2. Be an employee or subcontractor of a U.S. federal government entity or for-profit private industry. They may serve as collaborators, but no grant funds may be directed toward these individuals. 3. Concurrently hold another AACR grant. a. Current AACR grantees may apply only if their current grant ends before the start of the grant term for this funding opportunity (i.e., November 1, 2027). Also, the terms of their current grant must stipulate that the final progress reports be approved by the AACR before November 1, 2027. 4. Be, or have been, a Principal Investigator on a substantial independent research award (e.g., an NIH R01 award, DP2 award, DP5 award, MIRA award, or the equivalent). These individuals are invited to apply for AACR grants for independent investigators. a. For the purposes of this grant, a substantial independent research award is defined as a grant that offers at least US \$250,000 (direct) per year for more than three years and must have undergone a peer-review process by active researchers and physician-scientists.

AACR-Bayer Stimulating Therapeutic Advances through Research Training (START) Grants

Purpose: Dramatic advances made in recent years towards precision medicine initiatives, biomarker and novel target identification, and high-throughput examination of genomic data, have resulted in a trove of valuable data that can inform the development of new therapeutics to combat cancer. However, to effectively harness this wealth of information and advance the discovery and development of new therapies for cancer patients, enhanced collaboration between academia and industry will be needed. These Grants represent an exciting and novel initiative to encourage and support such collaboration. These grants, which will provide support to

postdoctoral or clinical research fellows, combines research experiences in both an academic and industry setting, following a research timeline that will be of greatest benefit to the proposed work. The training provided through this grants program will be invaluable to young investigators, by allowing fellows to attain a comprehensive research experience that will make them highly desirable to potential employers in either academic research or the pharmaceutical industry. Likewise, academic research centers and industry will benefit from the introduction of such dual-trained individuals into the field. Each fellowship provides a three-year grant of US \$225,000 to support the salary and benefits of the fellow while working on a mentored cancer research project. Proposals focused on clinical research are highly encouraged. Applicants must plan to spend one year on site at a Bayer facility. One of a number of Bayer's locations are possible, at the discretion of Bayer. The year at Bayer will be determined on a case-by-case basis, and will be at a time agreed upon by the fellow, the academic supervisor, the Bayer mentor, and Bayer.
