He qualified with the principal class prize in internal medicine from St Bartholomew's Hospital, London and has a PhD from Imperial College London. His postgraduate training was in London at St Bartholomew's, Hammersmith and The Royal Marsden Hospitals, with spells in Brussels and The Cancer Institute Hospital, Tokyo. He has a long-standing interest in the communication of information to patients, and founded the CancerHelp UK website in 1994 (www.cancerhelp.org.uk), now one of the largest patient websites in the world and winner of many awards. He has written numerous research papers as well as a large number of contributions to multi-author textbooks and key review articles plus *Cancer: A Very Short Introduction*, a cancer book aimed at the general public. Professor James' research interests are focused on urological cancer, from early phase to large phase 3 trials. He is chief investigator on the STAMPEDE trial, the largest prostate cancer interventional trial, which is simultaneously assessing multiple treatment options in advanced prostate cancer.
