Getting Around Quickly

This Quick Start Guide is meant to be just that—a tool that can help you jump right in and find information in this book—and learn the basics of how to get around and enjoy your Bold right away.

We start with the nuts and bolts in our "Learning Your Way Around" section—what all the keys, buttons, switches, and symbols mean and do on your Bold. You will learn how to get inside the back of your Bold to remove and replace the battery, SIM card, and media card. Also learn how to use the **Menu** key, **Escape** key, **trackpad**, and other important buttons. We show you some great time-saving tips for menus and setting dates and times as well as how to multitask.

In "Working With the Wireless Network," we help you understand when the letters, numbers, and symbols at the top of your Bold screen tell you that you can make phone calls, send SMS text messages, send and receive email, or browse the Web. We also show you how to handle your Bold on an airplane when you might need to turn off the radios.

In "App Reference Tables," we've organized the app icons into general categories so you can quickly browse the icons and jump to a section in the book to learn more about the app a particular icon represents. Here are the tables:

Learning Your Way Around

To help you get comfortable with your Bold, we start with the basics—what the keys, buttons, ports, and trackpad do and how to open up the back cover to get at your battery, media, and SIM card. Then we move into how you start apps and navigate the menus. We end this section with a number of very useful time-saving tips and tricks about getting around the menus, setting dates and times, and many great ways to use the **Space** key.

Keys, Buttons, and Ports




Figure 1. Keys, buttons, and Ports on the BlackBerry Bold

Figure 1 shows all the things you can do with the buttons, keys, switches, and ports, on your Bold. Go ahead and try out a few things to see what happens. Try pressing the **Menu** key for two seconds, press and hold the 1 key, press the side **Convenience** keys, click on an icon, then press the **Escape** key. Have some fun getting acquainted with your device.

Inside Your Bold




Figure 2. Inside your Bold—The battery, media card, and SIM card slots

You have to get inside your Bold to access your battery, SIM card slot, and media card slot. The following instructions and Figure 2 show you how.

To Remove the Back Cover:

Slide the cover down and off the bottom of the BlackBerry.

To Insert a Memory Card (MicroSD format):

You do not need to remove the battery. Gently place the media card with the metal contacts facing down and slide it completely into the media card slot shown in Figure 2 below.

To Remove the Memory Card:

For Bold 9700: Press it in with your fingernail until it pops out, then remove it. For Bold 9650: Slide it out with your fingernail.

To Remove or Replace the Battery:

Gently put your fingernail under the edge of the battery (with the black or gray semicircle—see Figure 2) and pry it up and out. To replace it, place it in the slot with the metal contacts touching and press it down firmly into the BlackBerry.

To Insert a SIM Card (Required to Connect to a GSM phone network):

For Bold 9700, you first need to remove the battery to see the SIM card slot. Place the SIM card on the left edge with the notch in the upper left corner and slide it completely into the SIM card slot (see Figure 2).

To Replace the Back Cover:

Place the back cover on the bottom half of the device and slide it up to the top until it clicks or locks into place.

Starting and Exiting Icons




Figure 3. How to start and exit icons (apps)

You use the **trackpad**, **Menu** key, and **Escape** key to navigate around your BlackBerry, open folders, and select icons (Figure 3). The **Escape** key will get you back out one step at a time, while the **Red Phone** key will jump you all the way back to your **Home** screen. You can change the background image (wallpaper), also called the **Home** screen image, from your media player or camera. You can change the look and feel or **Theme** of your Bold by going into the **Options** icon and selecting **Theme** (see page 179.) Learn how to move icons (page 169) or hide icons (page 171).

Starting & Exiting Icons
